5. Newtown Randy

Newtown held a country fair or revel that was often rather lewd. It was abolished for many years but has been recently revived. Maybe it will again be a place where maids and boys can meet.

Man O' War

Men O' War pass by the island today. Some rest on the sea bottom close to the island, like the Mary Rose until it was raised recently. Susan is sadly saying farewell to her jolly tar.
